Daily Prayer: God made us for communion with Him, both here on earth and someday in heaven. We can begin to experience a bit of heaven here by cultivate a deeper friendship with God in prayer. Dedicate a minimum of 15 minutes a day to prayer and you will experience a greater sense of peace even when life gets a bit crazy.

Daily Reading of the Bible: Live by this rule: No Bible no breakfast, no Bible no bed. Before you take that first sip of coffee in the morning open up the Bible and read even a short passage, just a verse or two. Before you go to bed at the end of the day, open up the Scriptures again and take time to allow God's Word to wash over you. After all, the Bible is our Basic Instructions Before Leaving Earth!

Daily Devotions: Pick a favorite devotion and commit to praying it daily. Whether it be the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, or the Stations of the Cross, commit to spending time daily with a favorite devotion. If time is short, just pray one decade of the Rosary. If you, like me, enjoy exercising, take your Rosary with you to the gym or on your walk.

Daily Acts of Kindness: As disciples we are called to put our love of God into action. This can be done by committing ourselves to doing at least one act of kindness each day. For ideas, consider one of the corporal works of mercy. Think of ways to give "anonymously" so that we will not receive any credit or accolades.

As we make the minor "course change" from days of summer leisure to the structure of fall activities and a new school year, it is my prayer that we will find joy in living a more disciplined life as committed and faith filed disciples of the Lord!
